STREET SWEEPING 101: WHY DO WE SWEEP THE STREET?

Street sweepers remove dirt and debris from our streets and prevent it from entering our storm sewer system which is only designed to handle stormwater. It is untreated water that flows directly into the Quittie which can affect aquatic and wildlife.

Street sweepers are not designed to pick up tree debris, trash or dried grass and wet leaves. This jams the street sweeper causing costly repairs. Please pick up anything that might interfere with the street sweeper prior to street sweeping week.

Please do NOT rake leaves, grass or debris into the gutters or allow your grass to blow into the street when you are mowing. This also clogs the storm drains, causing street flooding.

As a reminder our street sweeping schedule starts the second Monday of each month.

North/South	Direction	3rd Sweeping	4th Sweeping
South Side	Streets running North & South	July 8	August 12
South Side	Streets running East & West	July 9	August 13
North Side	Streets running North & South	July 10	August 14
North Side	Streets running East & West	July 11	August 15

GREEN WASTE DISPOSAL

The Borough has arrangements with North Cornwall for disposal of green waste. There is also an agreement with Annville Township for bulk, green waste, cardboard and metal.

Residents who wish to participate with North Cornwall need to come into the Borough office to obtain a residency verification form before proceeding to North Cornwall Township. If you wish to use Annville’s Disposal, contact their town hall at 717-867-4476 Fees are associated with both Townships for disposal.
